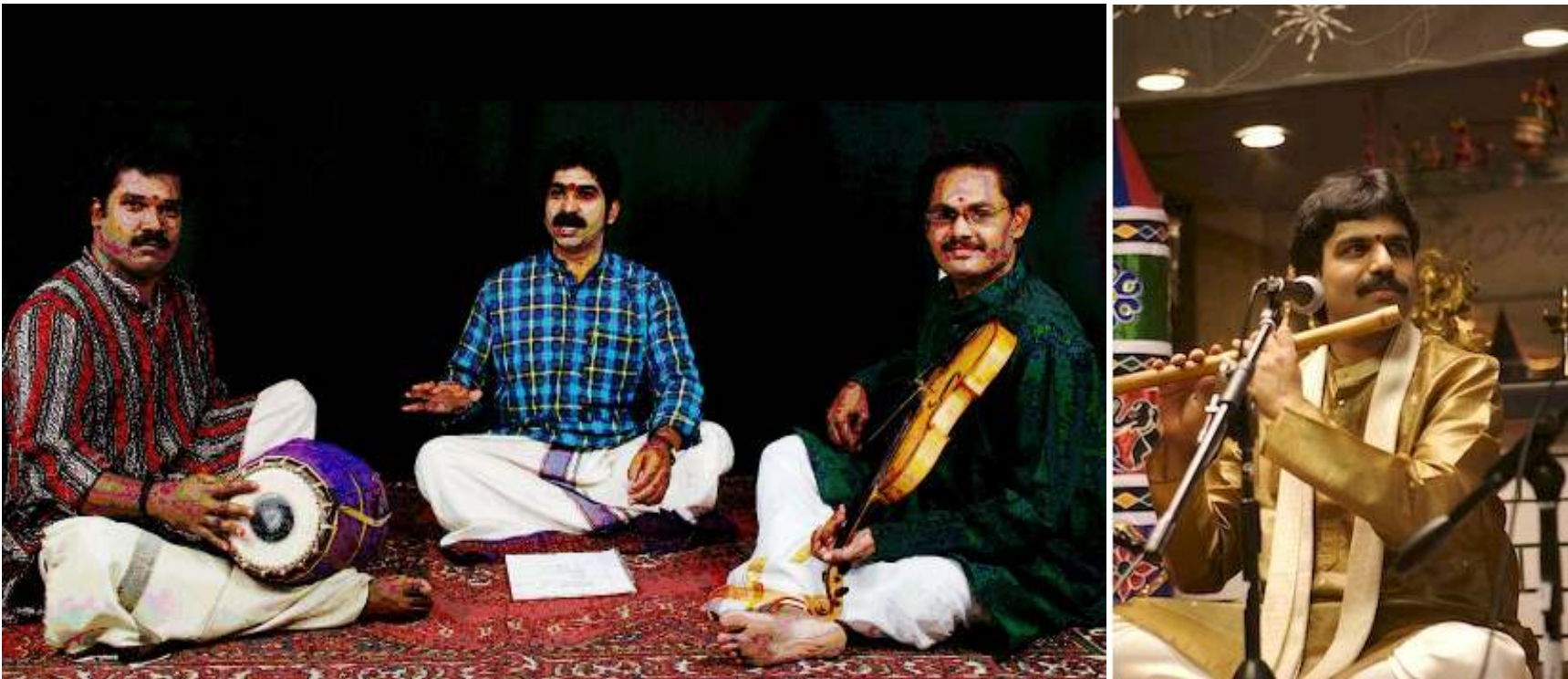


Great Opportunity to enjoy the live concert (Devotional Songs in Kannada, Tamil, Telugu and Hindi)!!!

The artists are:

1. B. S. Anand – Lead Vocalist

B.S Anand is a leading young vocalist from the state of Karnataka, India. Anand, a child prodigy is a disciple Vidushi. Smt. A. Rajamma Keshavamurthy a renowned vocalist from India. Music runs in his family & he is the son & disciple of the well known Violinist Vidwan Sri.B.K.Sheshadri of Bangalore .

2. Venkat – Mridangam

A Child prodigy , Venkat was born in a music loving family showed remarkable interest in the percussion instruments at the early age of 6. His parents recognized his talent & put him under the tutelage of Kalamamani V.P Ramdoss. Venkat performed small concerts at the early age of 9 and after several years of rigorous training, he had his advanced lessons from Kalaimamani Tiruvarur Bhakthavatsalam.
